All courses and patterns will be available the morning of each show. Ranch Riding pattern will be chosen from the PA 4-H Horse Show Rulebook.

- All competitors 18 years of age or under are required to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag.
- Supervised Walk-Trot/Jog For riders not yet ready to show on their own. Trainers are allowed in the arena to help the rider in understanding the prompts from the judge and as a safety measure to assist with any problems. Entrants not eligible for any other riding classes.
- Trail classes will run concurrently with classes in the Hull Ring-Ring 1. Every effort will be made to ensure no one will miss their classes.
- Maiden classes are intended for exhibitors with limited experience who have not won more than 3 blue ribbons at any horse show.
- Maiden Rider Ground Poles for riders with very limited show experience. Riders in these classes are only eligible for appropriate classes from 9-13.
- Exhibitor riding in classes they are not eligible for may ride but are Not to be judged.
- Riders showing in Open X-rails MAY enter in the Walk-Trot or Walk-Trot-Canter X-rail classes, but not both. Riders are not eligible for any other over fence classes

- For exhibitor planning purposes the Lead line Class will be worked into the show schedule for each show at a time between 11am and noon. It may not follow the same class at each show.
- Show management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes without at least 3 entries.
- Rings will be open for schooling on Friday evening prior to the shows and Saturday upon conclusion of the rings.
- Ring 1 will remain open for schooling on Saturday morning or Sunday morning until about 8:30am.
- Ring 2 will be open for Trail schooling until 10am each show day. Moving obstacles in the Trail ring for schooling purposes is allowed.
- Ring 3 will be open for schooling until about noon each show day.
- Animals may enter ONE (1) Halter Class (conformation)
- If an adult is showing a pony it may not be shown in pony classes by them.

Equestrians with Disabilities (EWD) classes will be shown at a walk and trot/jog ONLY Competitors in these classes may ride independently, or with aides and leaders.

- The EWD division is for riders of any age with a disability.
- Riders in EWD classes are not eligible for any other classes or divisions except the conformation halter classes and showmanship classes.

Ranch Classes- A natural and workmanlike appearance of the horse is preferred. Banding of the mane and use of tail extensions are not expected but will not be penalized. Workmanlike apparel and tack is acceptable and encouraged.

Ranch Trail-Exhibitors performing in a ranch trail class are asked to maneuver through six to nine obstacles that resemble the things that would be encountered during every day riding on a ranch. The horse is judged on a natural ranch horse appearance, and credit is given for a horse that performs the pattern smoothly, with willingness and efficiency. The horse will be asked to walk, trot and lope (or walk-trot) during the pattern

- Obstacles may include
 - o riding over obstacles (such as logs)
 - o passing through a gate
 - o Backing

- o Riding over a bridge
- o Side passing
- o Dragging (open and amateur only).

Ranch riding – This class measures a horse's ability to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a conveyance from performing one ranch task to another. The horse and rider are asked to perform a pattern that may include changes of gait, extension of gait, crossing logs and lead changes. All maneuvers should be performed as if the horse was being used on a ranch, and the horse should demonstrate a high level of training, relaxation and quality of movement in all gaits. Patterns will be selected from the PA4-H Rulebook. Copies will be available the morning of the show.

Ranch Pleasure-Light contact will be rewarded and horse shall not be shown on a full drape of the reins. Manners and responsiveness of the horse while performing and the quality of movement are the primary considerations. Gaits should be reasonably forward moving, free flowing, and ground covering. Transitions should be smooth and timely. Posting or standing at the extended trot is acceptable. Touching or holding the horn at the extended trot is acceptable.
